Hamm Shingle Recycling Is Open to Consumers and Contractors!

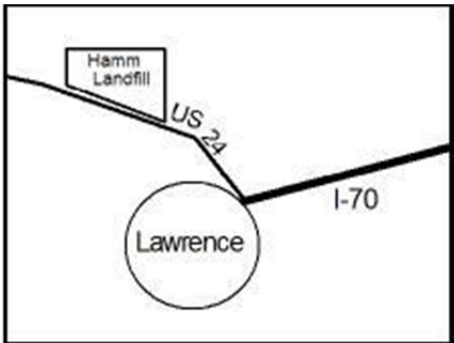

Recycling asphalt shingles conserves valuable landfill space and minimizes the amount of virgin resources used in the production of hot mix asphalt. By recycling asphalt shingles, contractors and roofing companies can enhance their public image and minimize disposal costs.

Recycling Information:

Cost for clean load: \$3.00 /ton
Cost for load with debris: \$45.00 /ton

What determines a "clean load"?
Acceptable items are:
- Asphalt Shingles
- Felt
- Nails

Unacceptable items:
- Wood
- Paper
- Metal Flashing
- Gutters
- Wrappers



RULES AND PROCEDURES FOR ASPHALT SHINGLE RECYCLING

AT HAMM SANITARY LANDFILL

Shingle Load Requirements

- Hamm reserves the right to charge processing or disposal fees (\$45/ton) for any loads that are deemed too contaminated.
- Wood, flashing, or debris must be placed on the top of the load. If debris is mixed in the entire shingle load, it will be charged for disposal at \$45.00/ton.
- Any debris or materials other than shingles should be placed on top on the load and put into rolloff dumpster at drop off area.
- Absolutely no cedar shake loads accepted for recycling. Hamm provides disposal service for cedar shake loads.
- Unacceptable Roofing materials: Loads must be asphalt shingles only without any debris. The shingles should be free of wood, plastics, large scrap metal, dirt, rocks, adhesives, solvents, petroleum contamination, and other trash harmful to the shingle recycling process. No hazardous or asbestos containing materials waste will be permitted. Federal law prohibits recycling of asbestos containing material (i.e., materials with over 1% asbestos).

Scale House

- Every load will be scaled before and after dumping.
- Each driver will be issued a weight ticket when they leave.

Drop-off Area

- A roll off container will be provided near shingle recycle area for any material/garbage located on top of the loads.
- No scavenging at the drop off area.
